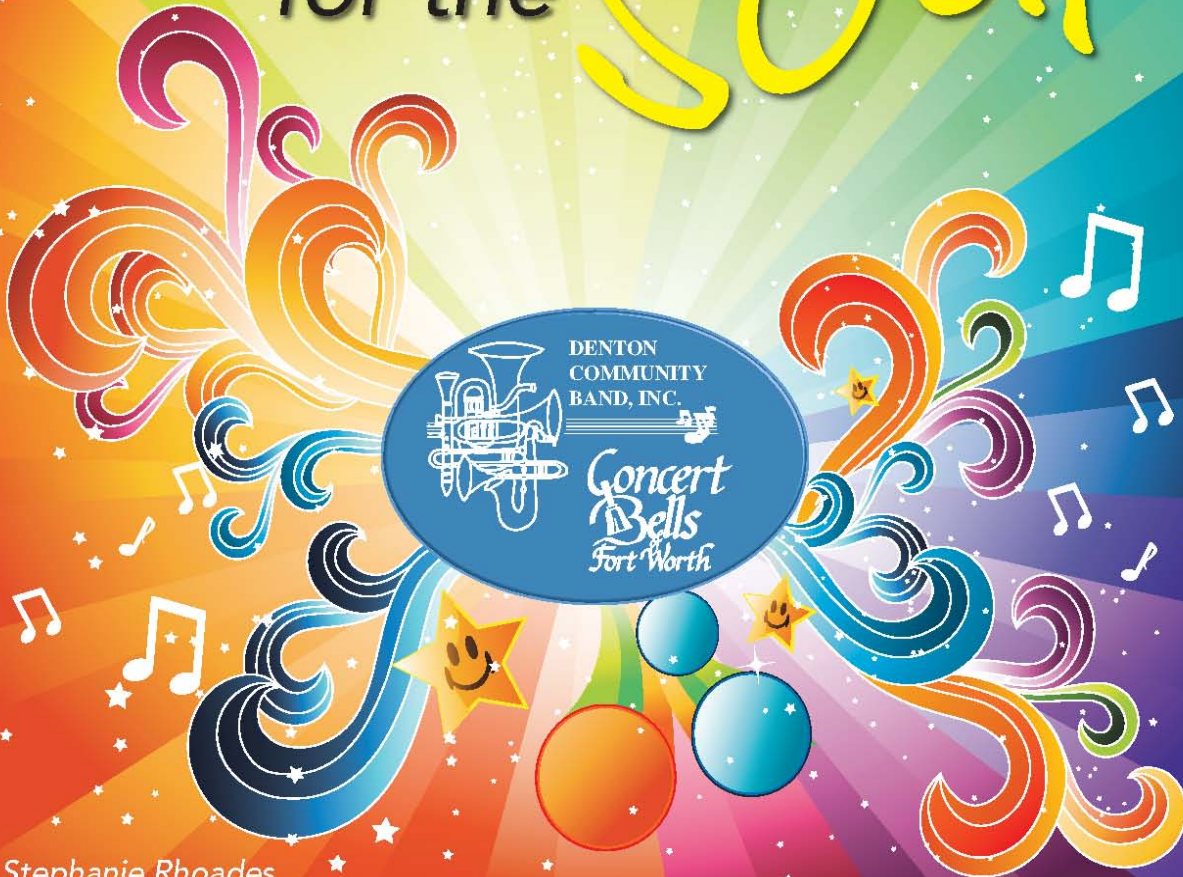

THE DENTON COMMUNITY BAND...

... has been in existence since 1976 with CAROL LYNN MIZELL as its Conductor since 1978. Over the years, the organization has performed numerous concerts in Denton and the surrounding area for such events as: **Denton Festival of Carols**, **Denton Festival Foundation Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony**, **Starrise Series** (Co-sponsored by the Denton Parks & Recreation Department), **Goblins Galore** (annual Children's Concert co-sponsored by Denton Parks & Recreation Department), **Denton Arts & Jazz Festival**, **Sanger Scelebration**, **Peterbilt Motors Children's Christmas Party**, **Kiwanis Children's Clinic Fireworks Show**, **Dedication of the All-War Memorial at the Courthouse on the Square**, **Dedication of the Flag Pole at the I.O.O.F. Cemetery**, **CARA** (Community Arts Recognition Award - Greater Denton Arts Council), **Cumberland Presbyterian Children's Home Lawn Party**, and worship services in area churches. The DCB was a part of the entertainment for **Senator Jane Nelson's Governor for a Day Celebration** on the Capitol steps in Austin in April, 2004.

The DCB's annual **Santa Serenades** travel throughout the Denton area with **Christmas Carols** for the person/family/party of the donor's choice, and for several years, the annual **Sweetheart Serenade** for Valentine's Day provided a romantic evening of **Big Band favorites** played by the **DCB Jazz Band**.

The DCB has collaborated for concerts with the **Texas Woman's University Flute Choir**, the **Denton Community Chorus**, **Denton Civic Ballet**, **Handbell Choirs** from local churches, the **Middle School Bands** from **Strickland MS**, **Calhoun MS**, and **McMath MS**, the **Drama Department of Strickland MS**, the **Trumpet Choir** from the **University of North Texas**, the **Liz Gallego School of Dance**, and **Concert Bells of Fort Worth**. In 1986, the DCB was named the **Official Sesquicentennial Band of Denton County**.

Membership in the band is open to adult players in the community and surrounding area.

Stephanie Rhoades, CBFW Conductor, is Associate Director of Music at Grace Presbyterian Church in Plano where she directs children's and middle school handbell choirs, a children's vocal choir, and supervises a graded children's choir program. She also teaches 1st and 2nd grade music at Parish Episcopal School in Dallas. Ms. Rhoades earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in music from Yale University and Master of Sacred Music degree from Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University.

The daughter of two musicians, she began playing violin and trumpet at a young age, has been active in handbell ringing for over twenty years (including solo/ensemble ringing), was a member of the Dallas Handbell Ensemble, and Interim Director of Concert Bells of Fort Worth (Christmas 2000). Her experience includes directing children's, youth, and adult handbell choirs, and she is currently Past-Chair of the Area IX Board of the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers and is a Past-President of the Dallas Chapter of Choristers Guild.

During the last several years she has served as President of the Greater Dallas Handbell Association, Secretary of the Dallas Chapter of Choristers Guild and a local clinician in handbells and children's music.

Pam Adams has been ringing handbells since 1989 at First United Methodist Church - Richardson, where she remained an active ringer until the spring of 2007. While pursuing her BBA in Marketing at Baylor University, she rang with the Baylor University Handbell Ensemble under the direction of Debra Jackson. Pam currently serves as Publications Chair of Area IX Board of AGEHR, and also rings in a local sextet called "Sounds of Six". She is employed by a jewelry manufacturer/wholesaler as an Account Specialist and resides with her family in Mesquite.

Kari Daelke is a graduate of Valparaiso University, Valparaiso, Indiana and began ringing handbells in 1980 when her sorority big sis suggested she come to the first rehearsal of a new beginner handbell group she was directing. Who knew it would develop into a lifelong passion for ringing that has included concert tours, ringing in church and advanced community groups, attending many area, national and international ringing events such as Loire Valley Handbell Festival in France, Distinctly Bronze (2004, 2005, 2007) and the Inaugural UK Bronze 2006 in England. She is a member of King of Glory Lutheran Church in Dallas where she rings and helps select and coordinate repertoire for the adult handbell choir. She also rings in a small ensemble, The Sounds of Six. Professionally, she is a full time as a graphic artist / pre-press manager at Rapid Reprographics in Dallas.

Elizabeth Garvin joined Concert Bells in the spring of 2004. She began ringing handbells in the Alief Independent School District over 19 years ago. While at Alief Elsik High School, under the direction of Molly Ness, Elizabeth rang in an advanced handbell class, Monday through Friday, where all music was performed memorized and without a director. While at Texas A&M University, Elizabeth's handbell director offered her the opportunity to direct a children's handbell choir. She was ecstatic! Teaching children how to ring handbells was no longer a dream; it was reality! After graduating in 2001, she's been able to continue directing a children's handbell choir at First United Methodist Church Richardson. Elizabeth works at Concentra as a QA Analyst, lives in Lewisville, is happily married and has a wonderful stepdaughter, Danielle.

♪ **Jean Harden**, charter member and treasurer of CBFW, started to ring handbells in 1994 at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church, Denton, Tex., and is now Director of Adult Handbells there. She has taught at regional and national AGEHR conventions and served on the Board of Area IX. A music librarian by profession, Jean has also been active as a musicologist and has taught musicology, music history, music bibliography, and music librarianship at the university level. She received degrees in music and librarianship from Emory, Cornell, and Syracuse Universities and is a published author of articles about music. She moved to Denton to take her current job as a music librarian at the University of North Texas.

♪ **Quinda Hatfield** received her Bachelor of Music degree from Oklahoma State University. She began ringing handbells in 1981 and within a few weeks became the director. After almost 15 years as Director of Music/Organist/Handbell Director at St. Philip Presbyterian Church in Hurst, she retired. Her career in church music spanned over 35 years. She is looking forward to playing with her grandchildren and seeing where the Spirit leads.

Cathy Herring is a graduate of the University of North Carolina with a degree in Music Education. Originally a violinist, Cathy has been ringing handbells for over 25 years at First United Methodist Church of Richardson where she also directs a youth handbell choir. Cathy and her husband Bill have a daughter Lee, two sons, Charles and Patrick, and a grandson, Corbin. She is employed as the comptroller of OnLine Insurance Services.

Nancy Jarrett has been ringing handbells for over 15 years, and she directed the youth and adult handbell choirs at the First United Methodist Church of Coppell for 3 years. She is a graduate of UNT with a Bachelor of Music (Summa Cum Laude) and Master of Music in Horn Performance. She is an active freelance musician and has performed with many metroplex ensembles including the Dallas Wind Symphony, Richardson Symphony, Las Colinas/Garland Symphony, Orchestra of New Spain, East Texas Symphony, Abilene Philharmonic, San Angelo Symphony, and Lone Star Wind Orchestra, as well as numerous musical theatre productions. Nancy also maintains a studio of about 55 horn students in Coppell ISD. On those rare occasions when she has free time, Nancy enjoys cycling or reading a good book.

Carol Lynn is an active Conductor and Clinician for area and national handbell events. She is a published composer, holds membership in Texas Music Educators Association, American Guild of English Handbell Ringers, and Sigma Alpha Iota, and serves on the Handbell Committee for the Fellowship of United Methodists in Music and Worship Arts.
